TYLER KIVEL holds a Master of Music degree in piano performance and literature from the University of Illinois Champaign-Urbana. He earned his Bachelor of Music degree from Central Michigan University. Tyler has given performances as a soloist and chamber musician throughout the Midwest. He was awarded the John N. Irwin Memorial Scholarship along with other competition-based awards, including his Carnegie Hall debut in April 2018. As a soloist, Tyler has been featured with the Lakeshore Symphony Orchestra and the CMU Symphonic Wind Ensemble. He made his Chicago debut as the musical director of *Thrones! The Musical Parody* based on the hit television series *Game of Thrones*. The show was featured on Fox 32 News in live performance. In addition to solo performances, Kivel has performed in privately produced cabarets at iO improv theatre, at Davenport's Piano Bar, and with Artists Giving Back. He taught among the faculty at the Chicago High School for the Arts (ChiArts), performs with the Civic Orchestra of Chicago, restores organs with JL Weiler, Inc., and is organist at First Presbyterian Church of LaGrange, Illinois. Kivel's teachers include Dr. Alexandra Mascolo-David and Prof. William Heiles.
