HOLY COMMUNION. We celebrate the Lord's Supper on June 5 and July 3. Anticipating these celebrations, we pray: "Loving God, you have given us a share in the one bread and the one cup and made us one with Christ. Help us to bring your salvation and joy to all the world. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen." (*Book of Common Worship*, p. 157)

WEDNESDAY SERVICE OF SCRIPTURE AND PRAYER – CANCELLED. Wednesday midday services began in summer 2020 as opportunities to pray outdoors in group during pandemic time. Attendance peaked in summer 2021, when community guests joined us in the garden. Usual in-person activities regained energy in late 2021, but attendance at the Wednesday service dropped; and, in the months of January to March 2021, attendance dwindled to two to four people. Midday gatherings will stop for an indefinite period beginning in June. However, mark your calendars for a new gathering of Music and the Spoken Word explained below.

MUSIC AND THE SPOKEN WORD – MONTHLY SERVICE TO BEGIN IN SEPTEMBER. A new monthly gathering begins in September 2022 that includes reflection, contemplation, and prayer. Thirty-minute Music and the Spoken Word services will take place at 6:30 p.m. on the following Wednesdays: September 7, October 5, November 2, and December 7. Services include a time for silence, readings, prayers, and musical offerings. This is an excellent opportunity for evangelism and mission, especially if we get the word out.

GOOD SAMARITAN FUND | **APRIL 2022.** We participate with fourteen other congregations in the Good Samaritan Fund of Tuscola County Churches. In April, the Fund dispersed \$5,615.96 serving 12 households (51 persons) to help pay bills. The pantry dispersed 3,485 pounds of food serving 80 households (269 persons). Deposits totaled \$2,394. Other expenses totaled \$229.20.

ORGAN MUSIC. Among other composers, sacred organ music utilized during summer months highlights the output of musicians Alexandre Guilmant (1837-1911) and Johann Gottfried Walther (1684-1748). French organist Guilmant is perhaps best known for his improvisations, broad musical output, and concertizing with more than forty unique recitals on the St. Louis Exposition Organ in 1904. J. G. Walther lived at the same time as his cousin, master composer Johann Sebastian Bach. He is best known for his variations on German chorale melodies that are still used by Protestant congregations worldwide.

TREASURER'S REPORT | **APRIL 2022.** We received the last of the insurance payments for damage done to the basement from the costly sewer backup of 2019.
